




Practical Ways to Reach Out and Touch Friends, Relatives, and Co-Workers


16. Plan strategies to meet needs.

Ways to Reach Co-Workers


1. Accept them for who they are. Look past their faults and see their need.
2. Get them involved in non-denominational youth groups or activities.
3. Take advantage of holidays like Thanksgiving. Make sure everyone participates; give testimonies and read scripture.
4. Express your love and appreciation in a non-threatening way.
5. Develop a relationship and a trust. Be a servant.
6. Keep in communication with them. Write a letter or call them once in a while. Write a letter once a month or send a tape to show appreciation.
7. Let them know that you're praying for them.
8. Don't be judgmental.
9. Tell them about answered prayers of you and other Christians.



10. Be the example.
11. Have obedient children.
12. Be a listening ear.
13. Don't put yourself above them.
14. Hug them and tell them you love them.
15. Give them information about church and about God.
16. Gifts can be a witness by how it meets the need or just by the gift (a Bible, Christian books, tapes).
17. Write a letter once a month or send a tape to show appreciation.
18. Send a care package.
19. Rebuild relationships slowly.



1. Work unto the Lord—do your best at your job.

3. Be sensitive to others' moods.
4. Let people know you are a Christian. Post Scripture in your work areas/lockers, etc.
5. Take time to fellowship with co-workers; take them out to lunch.
6. Be a good listener.
7. Find common ground and ask them questions.
8. Pray for them and let them know it.
9. Be available; don't get into a clique.
10. Help new co-workers (training)
11. Humbly do more than your share. godliness and holiness.

13. Apologize and ask forgiveness when wrong.
14. Don't gossip or back-bite. Keep confidences.

20. Show that your mind is on work as well as on the Lord.
21. Work your required time and stay late if necessary— joyfully!
22. Be thankful for your job, no matter what the pay is. Have a good attitude.
23. Use contemporary relatable parables (word pictures) to illustrate the biblical principles.
24. Bring in snacks to share.
25. Send cards around the office for signatures to those who are sick or have birthdays.
26. Have a get-together for co-workers and spouses.
27. Look for ways to introduce co-workers with a Christian brother and/or sister.
28. Talk about fellow Christians, rather than the church.
29. Wear Christian pens and jewelry.
30. Take pride in your work area. Leave it in good shape.

- 32.** Be a team member and encourage others to do so.
- 33.** Honor any anti-evangelism rules your work place may have.
- 34.** Share with other Christians so that others can hear you (if allowed).
- 35.** Invite them to a special service.
